






Domestic greenhouse gas emissions by sector (2018)










Domestic transport greenhouse gas emissions by mode




# How we travelled in 2019 (NTS Data)

"We want to see a future where half of all journeys in towns and cities are cycled or walked.


58% of car journeys in 2018 were under 5 miles.

And in urban areas, more than 40% of journeys were under 2 miles"







# Chart 8: "Comparing now to before there was a confirmed case of coronavirus in the UK, how much are you using the following modes:"




## Chart 9: "How likely, if at all, will you continue walking or cycling more after travel restrictions and social distancing are removed?"

Latest numbers from the National Travel Attitudes Survey (NTAS) are from 2019.






### **National Bus Strategy**

- All leading to increased revenue to support services.





### "A future where half of all journeys in towns and cities are cycled or walked"

- Four themes:
  - better streets for cycling and people
  - cycling and walking at the heart of decision-making
  - empowering and encouraging local authorities
  - enabling people to cycle and protecting them when they do





## Local transport plans (Section 108 – Transport Act 2000)

Each local transport authority must develop policies for the promotion and encouragement of safe, integrated, efficient and economic transport to, from and within their area, and carry out their functions so as to implement those policies.

Each local transport authority must... in developing policies... and in carrying out their functions.. comply with the duties to

- take into account any policies announced by Her Majesty's government, and
- have regard to any guidance issued for the purposes of this paragraph by the Secretary of State,

with respect to mitigation of, or adaptation to, climate change or otherwise with respect to the protection or improvement of the environment.
