Draft Terms of Reference	<ul> <li>Hannah noted it was great that the group have formal terms of reference.</li> <li>The following were raised as part of the discussion for the draft Terms of Reference: <ul> <li>The group is a safe space to have discussions</li> <li>The TOR will need a date on it to ensure people know when they need to be reviewed</li> <li>Important to be agile to respond to consultations as a region</li> <li>Acting as a forum to respond to government consultations, policy etc. For example a number of areas are reviewing bus plans and responding to the national bus strategy – is there an opportunity to deal with these topics as a region?</li> <li>Potentially be a 'sounding board' for government departments in relation to proposals – currently respond to these nationally but not regionally</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	

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	Angela thanked colleagues for their suggestions and agreed to strengthen the terms of reference. ACTION: Angela to revise terms of reference to incorporate comments made at the June meeting	
TfN Decarbonisation Strategy – Peter Cole	<ul> <li>made at the June meeting</li> <li>TFN_Decarbonisati on Presentation Slid</li> <li>Peter shared the above presentation in relation to the TfN Decarbonisation Strategy.</li> <li>Key messages: <ul> <li>Strategy went out to public consultation last week and will run for 12 weeks</li> <li>Freight and Logistics Strategy currently being prepared and will be consulted on</li> <li>Transport Related Social Exclusion (TRSE) – potential for wider risks and adverse consequences particularly when they impact different sections of communities. Work to be undertaken to mitigate risks. Intend to undertake specific research in relation to decarbonisation and TRSE.</li> <li>Commitments made in strategy in relation to climate change adaptation and resilience</li> <li>Monitoring and evaluation taking place at each step – focus and approach will be adjusted when needed</li> <li>Number of webinars to take place</li> </ul> </li> <li>Phil noted TRSE is an important topic and something which is currently being looked at within Cheshire and Warrington in relation to potential inclusivity issues that could arise from a decarbonisation perspective. Peter noted that government have proposed a phase out (not a ban) – so this doesn't mean that there won't be combustion cars running. Peter noted that research and evidence is required as this is a very complex issue not singularly relating to deprivation.</li> </ul>	
	inclusive growth commission David queried whether grid capacity and grid connectivity had been considered in relation to the EV connections required. Peter noted this was a concern but also an opportunity. He noted that there needed to be a skills push – colleagues are already setting up for grassroot charities to look at the installation aspect and interestingly look at converting current cars to electric cars. Local grid connections will be looked at further and consultancy support is also currently out to procurement.
