

Digital Connectivity Working Group Update

Since the last update report in February 2022, the ADEPT Digital Connectivity Working Group has met twice virtually in April and July attendance from Local Authorities across the UK, but also from D2N2 LEP and Local Government Association (LGA).

Local Authority representatives from Wolverhampton, Somerset, Herefordshire, Cambridgeshire, Kent, Barnsley, Nottinghamshire, Staffordshire, Shropshire, and South Gloucestershire were present in both of the meetings.

Meeting No. 1 (April 2022) The Group received presentations from:

- a) Will Plant Digital Inclusion Programme Manager about the Digital Connectivity Toolkit. The toolkit has been created by City of Westminster, in conjunction with the Local Government Association with the aim to share the best practice and lessons learned from their experience of working to improve full fibre connectivity in a highly urban environment. - b) Gareth Elliott from Mobile UK updated the group members on:
 - The Shared Rural Network
 - Issues about the planning applications and the increase on the number rejections

c) The Local Government Association's Digital Champion and Gloucestershire County Leader, Councillor Mark Hawthorne MBE about Digital Connectivity Champions. Mark talked about how 5G will enable councils and councillors to deliver their digital transformation strategies and used real life examples to illustrate this. As examples, he stated how 5G will allow all to use smart data, deliver smart services and create smart communities. Mark also explained how councillors play an integral role in ensuring local communities have a better awareness and understanding of 5G.
