NSIP sector overview



- Wave of solar NSIPs up to 50 schemes in public domain or emerging 150MW to 500MW+
- Carbon capture & pipeline NSIPs at least 3 networks
- Hydrogen production & pipeline NSIPs at least 2 networks
- Water infrastructure big wave of reservoirs, water transfer pipelines, desalinisations – NSIPs & section 35 DCOs
- Waste water infrastructure NSIPs
- Rail East West Rail NSIP; local authority rail NSIPs (e.g. Bristol MetroWest)
- Strategic Rail Freight NSIPs wave coming to an end
- Ports NSIPs new wave emerging

NSIP sector overview



- Highways NSIPs National Highways & local authority NSIPs
- Offshore wind NSIPs another wave coming through
- Interconnector & National Grid 'bootstrap' NSIPs ScotWind another wave emerging
- National Grid GREEN overhead line NSIPs monsters!
- Airports NSIPs Gatwick, Luton, (Heathrow)
- Gas power stations NSIPs hydrogen only now
- Energy from Waste NSIPs
- Nuclear power station NSIPs
- Nuclear waste geological disposal facility NSIP

- DLUHC NSIP Action Plan including 'Project Speed'– imminent launch [now launched see later]
- A66 as pilot for Project Speed
- Fast track for offshore wind
- Levelling Up and Regeneration Bill
- National Infrastructure Commission review of National Policy Statement process
- Environmental Outcomes Reporting continuing uncertainty re what this means in practice
- Review of Habitats regime

- Delays to NSIP decisions transport & energy
- Judicial reviews & crowdfunding
- Resourcing for LPAs and statutory bodies to participate in NSIP process – role of PPAs at each stage, including post consent

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NSIP Action Plan – 23 February 2023

- Ministerial foreword DLUHC, DESNZ, DfT, Defra
- NSIP regime needs to be:
- Better
- Faster
- Greener
- Fairer
- More resilient
- Evolution, not revolution but a major refresh/reset,18 months in the making
- Aiming to get back to original certainty of 17 month timetable, with a fast track for less complex projects which meet quality standards
- NB the Action Plan is <u>not</u> for consultation detailed consultations to follow



- Reform Area 1: Strategic direction
- National Policy Statements to be kept up to date
- National Infrastructure Commission review of NPS process
- Water resources NPS Q1 2023
- Energy NPSs further consultation imminent, designation by Q2 2023
- National Networks NPS review under way, designation during 2023
- Reform Area 2: Operational reform for faster process [see later slide]
- Reform Area 3: Better outcomes for the environment
- Environmental Outcome Reporting instead of EIA
- Streamline assessment process & focus on environmental commitments



- HRA reform
- Biodiversity Net Gain (onshore & intertidal) for all NSIPs "from November 2025" (precise trigger not stated)
- Special changes for offshore wind HRA
- Reform Area 4: role of local communities & engagement
- More funding for Local Authority Innovation & Capacity Fund (10 existing projects)
- Funding for earlier engagement by LPAs with NSIPs to support better outcomes for communities
- Measures to support more effective use of PPAs
- Local Authority Support Network, building on reform Working Group
- Guidance on community engagement expectations



- Reform Area 5: system capability
- Workforce strategies
- Full and proportionate cost recovery
- Quality standards for fast track applications



- Reform Area 2: Operational reform
- Enhanced (paid) pre-application service for applicants
- Updated guidance on acceptance test
- More proportionate examination process process of engagement with process
- Review of Examination procedure rules, especially for less complex projects
- Fast track option (4 months Examinations), linked to quality standards & use of enhanced pre-application service
- Review of post consent material and non-material change process
- New PINS application service portal
- Pilots and 'early adopter programme' is in preparation



- Spring 2023: consultations expected on streamlining the examination process, fast track consenting process (including identification of suitable projects) and full cost recovery
- September 2023: pilot for key aspects of the reforms including new fast track consenting process to take place
- Spring 2024: key regulatory and guidance changes to be introduced including recovery of proportionate costs by PINS and consultees
- General Election: end 2024/early 2025
- From 2025: Environmental Outcome Reports to be introduced and a more digital and agile PINS will be unveiled
