6	Annual reporting 6.1 Annual Review 2025/26 and Forward Plan 2026/27 Despite significant pressures on budgets, LA membership has remained static while we have recruited more Corporate Partners and Combined Authorities. Our events continue to attract excellent numbers, both online and in-person. Securing sponsorship income is becoming more challenging, however.	Hannah Bartram

With thanks to our Corporate Partners, we introduced a Bursary Fund to support LA attendance at the spring & autumn conferences.

We launched two exciting new programmes last summer:

- The Carbon Leadership Programme, in partnership with Proving Services.
- The Digital Academy, with Multiverse.

Our L&D programmes continue to go from strength to strength, and we plan to launch an Energy Systems Training Programme this year.

We met with a number of MPs, as our profile with parliamentarians continues to grow. We also responded to a number of government consultations (the NPPF taking the prize – our response was almost 90 pages, and we did not respond to every one of the 225 questions) and select committee inquiries.

Last May we established a monthly meeting for those place directors going through significant political change; we recently published a briefing note on the same issue.

Over 450 people attended the series of LGR and devo webinars we ran last summer; and we are publishing a LGR highways toolkit today.

Along with existing good links to DfT and Defra, our connections with MHCLG and DESNZ are improving plus we are developing closer links to DfE in relation to Homes to School Transport issues and DSIT with regards to mobile infrastructure planning.

The seven Live Lab projects finally concluded after three years of testing & trialling different approaches to reducing carbon emissions and delivering efficiencies at the same time.

We secured additional funding for the Live Labs 2 programme – this will be used to ‘shift the dial’ on adoption of the successful LL2 outputs; to ensure those ideas and solutions are understood, adopted and embedded in the local highways sector across the UK.

We published An Introduction to Talking Climate communications guide, developed in partnership with Yorkshire & Humber Climate Commission.

- We worked with the Environment Agency to develop a Rapid Adaptation Pathways Assessment toolkit, to help local authorities take adaptation actions at the right time and avoiding the cost associated with acting too early or too late.

6.2 Financial report 2025/26

Key points

In summary the overall surplus for 2025/26 was £13k against a budgeted deficit of £16k – a positive variance of £29k.

	<p>Key reasons for this are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New commercial partnerships – primarily the Carbon Leadership Programme and Digital Academy - which are generating a healthy surplus. • Recruiting new Corporate Partners. • Continued high demand for our L&D programmes. <p>We have just under £300k in reserves – this money is split across a number of high interest savings accounts.</p> <p>The budget for 2026/27 currently shows an End of Year deficit – primarily due to additional expenditure on admin and policy support, and public affairs work.</p> <p>We will work to tackle this by securing higher levels of sponsorship, agreeing more commercial partnerships, and launching new paid-for programmes.</p>
