#### UK telecommunications infrastructure and the UK's domestic capability

The next generation of mobile telecommunications (known as '5G') promises faster download speeds, more reliable connections and technical abilities that enable new systems such as autonomous vehicles or connected health devices.

Responding to concerns raised by Members of Parliament last month, the Secretary of State for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport told the House of Commons that the Government is not yet in a position "to set out a specific date or timetable for reaching no high-risk vendors" but that the Government would work with the "Five Eyes (Australia, Canada, New Zealand, US and UK) and other partners" to develop new supply chain capacity in our national infrastructure during the course of the Parliament. In this context, the Science and Technology Committee has launched an inquiry to understand how telecommunications capacity can be built in the UK.
